VISIT US

Getting to the Seymour is easy. Here are our recommendations.

CAR

The closest secure car park is on the corner of Cleveland St and Shepherd St. Limited free parking is available at the University of Sydney and in the surrounding streets.

BUS

A bus stop is located on City Rd directly outside the Seymour, with frequent services throughout the day.

TRAIN

The closest train stations are Redfern (10 minute walk) and Central (20 minute walk).

ACCESS

Access parking is located on Maze Cres within the University of Sydney, and there is lift access to all levels of the centre.

Wheelchair seating is available in all venues, and fully accessible toilets are located on the ground floor. Hearing loops are available in the Everest and York theatres.
