After twenty-one years with the Sydney Theatre Company, we thought it was probably time we left the comfort of home and struck out into the wide world on our own. Thankfully, many of the talented people who have helped bring *The Wharf Revue* to life each year came with us, so the process of putting the show together seemed much like any other we've done, except the hall was draughtier and we had to buy our own biscuits.

You, our loyal audience, have also stayed with us. Which the accountant tells us is just as well. As the country drifts under increasingly incompetent governments and the world faces a seemingly endless list of existential crises, now is the time to get back into a theatre and have a good laugh about it all. Satire has always been a collective release valve for the powerless and our shows have long been informed by that classic Australian cartoon: "For gorsake, stop laughing – this is serious!"

But this year, reflecting the times, perhaps the show occasionally strikes a sombre note. For while satire may not ultimately effect much change in this world, it does remind us of what needs to be changed.

Jonathan Biggins

Creator/Writer/Director/Performer
Jonathan Biggins is an awardwinning writer, director and
performer, perhaps best known

for his bravura turn as Paul Keating in his smash hit play The Gospel According to Paul and as one of the creators and performers for the long-running and much loved annual political satire, The Wharf Revue, previously produced under the auspices of Sydney Theatre Company and now being produced independently. As an actor Jonathan has also worked with all of the major theatre companies, including Sydney Theatre Company, Melbourne Theatre Company and the State Theatre Company of SA, and has appeared on multiple comedy shows on the ABC. He is the winner of two Australian Writers' Guild awards for The Republic of Myopia and for a new libretto for Orpheus in the Underworld (with Phil Scott), and a Helpmann Award for Best Director for Avenue Q. His two full-length plays, Australia Day (2012) and Talk (2017), both premiered at Sydney Theatre Company before touring nationally.

A graduate of NIDA, Drew
Forsythe joined The Old Tote
Theatre Co as a company

member for four seasons which included the opening of the Opera House Drama Theatre. As a member of the Nimrod Theatre Co Drew performed in Biggles (which opened the Nimrod, now Stables, Theatre), The Bacchoi (which opened the New Nimrod, now Belvoir St. Theatre), Much Ado About Nothing, Richard the Third, Twelfth Night, The Seagull, Gone With Hardy, Comedy of Errors, The Club, Romeo and Juliet, The Venetian Twins, Three Sisters and The Servant of Two Masters. Most of these with John Bell mentoring and directing. With Sydney Theatre Company Drew has appeared in most of the 26 Wharf Revues, Shorts at the Wharf (which opened the Wharf Theatre), Hedda Gabler, The Way of the World, Amadeus, Emerald City, Big and Little, The Trackers of Oxyrhynchus, The Recruit, Volpone, Harbour, The Republic of Myopia (which opened the Roslyn Packer Theatre), The Way of the World, The Give and Take, Under Milk Wood and Mrs Warren's Profession. Musicals include Strictly Ballroom, Big River, Lasseter, The Threepenny Opera, The Mikado, Pirates of Penzance, HMS Pinafore, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum and

The Merry Widow. Drew has performed with the Australian Chamber Orchestra in Michael Leunig's Carnival of the Humans and with The Song Company in L'Amfiparnaso, a concert. He has appeared in the films Stone, Deathcheaters, Caddie, Newsfront, Doctors and Nurses, Ginger Meggs, Burke and Wills, Annie's Coming Out, Travelling North, Billy's Holiday and Ned, and on television in Devil's Dust, David Tench Tonight, The Miraculous Mellops, The Dingo Principle, The Party Machine, Whose Baby and Three Men a Baby Grand. His awards include Green Room Award Best Actor in a Musical (The Mikado), Variety Award Best Actor in a Musical (The Venetian Twins), AFI Best Supporting Actor (Caddie) and Penguin Award Best Actor in a Mini-Series (Whose Baby). His writing credits include The Wharf Revue, The Republic of Myopia, Three Men and a Baby Grand and The Last Man Standing.

Phillip Scott is a writer/actor/
composer/pianist, best known
for the annual the Wharf Revue.

His cabarets include the award-winning solo show Reviewing the Situation, Mario (with Blake Bowden), Newley Discovered (with Hugh Sheridan), and No Cabaret for Old Men (with Jonathan Biggins). He worked with director Ted Robinson on many ABC TV series including The Gillies Report, The Big Gig and Good News Week. Phil was Script Consultant on Priscilla, Queen of the Desert - The Musical. He co-wrote and composed the musicals Safety in Numbers and The Republic of Myopia, and wrote the music and lyrics for Monkey Baa Theatre's childrens shows including Pete the Sheep and Josephine Wants to Dance. With Trevor Ashley he co-wrote the adult pantos Fat Swan, Little Orphan Trashley, The Bodybag, and The Lyin' Queen. Phil recently played Dr. Pangloss and Narrator in Leonard Bernstein's Candide at the Sydney Opera House, and was Musical Director/ Arranger of Torch Song Trilogy for the Darlinghurst Theatre Company. With Catherine Alcorn, he appeared at the Hayes Theatre in 30 Something, set on New Year's

Eve 1939. Phil has published four novels and is also a music reviewer for *Limelight* and *Fanfare* magazines.
