Originally presented in 2014 to rave reviews and sold-out audiences, Damien Ryan's reprisal production of *The Crucible* offers students a rare, immersive and immensely detailed vision of this great play. Lit by fire, an exceptional cast turns the heat up in a story as relevant today as when Arthur Miller wrote it.

Miller's parable of mass hysteria draws a savage parallel between the Salem witch-hunt of 1692—"one of the strangest and most awful chapters in human history"—and the McCarthyism that gripped America in the 1950s.

A searing exploration of persecution through ignorance, fear of 'otherness,' and our capacity to serve ourselves above all others, *The Crucible* reflects the ordinary evils latent in every society, and is one of the world's most timelessly relevant stories.

Winner of the 2018 Griffin Award, *Prima Facie* is an indictment of the Australian legal system's failure to provide reliable pathways to justice for women in rape, sexual assault or harassment cases. It's a work of fiction, but one that could have been ripped from the headlines of any paper, any day of the week, so common you could cry.

Sheridan Harbridge stars as Tessa—a criminal lawyer at the top of her game who knows the law permits no room for emotion.

To win, you just need to believe in the rules. And Tessa loves to win, even when defending clients accused of sexual assault. Her court-ordained duty trumps her feminism. But when she finds herself on the other side of the bar, Tessa is forced into the shadows of doubt she's so ruthlessly cast over other women.

Turning Sydney's courts of law into a different kind of stage, Suzie Miller's (*Sunset Strip*, *Caress/Ache*) taut, rapid-fire and gripping one-woman show exposes the shortcomings of a patriarchal justice system where it's her word against his.

Maybe we need a new system.

Note: *Prima Facie* is a challenging theatre production, raising big questions to inspire passionate classroom discussion. Invaluable for Stage 6 Drama and Legal Studies students, *Prima Facie* contains adult themes and verbal descriptions of sexual violence.

TRANSPORT

The Seymour has easy drop-off and pick-up points for school buses on City Road or Shepherd Street (see map below). Please note there is no bus parking available onsite.

By train, we are a 10 minute walk from Redfern Station or a 20 minute walk from Central Station.

ACCESS

Access parking is located on Maze Crescent within the University of Sydney, a short walking distance to the Seymour entrance. There is lift access to all levels of the centre and wheelchair seating is available in all venues. Hearing loops are available in the Everest and York Theatres, and fully accessible toilets are located on the ground floor.

ON THE DAY

For many students, their trip to the Seymour could be their first theatre experience. Below are some tips to share with your class:

- Arrive on time. Latecomers may only be allowed in at certain intervals during a performance. Missing the start of the performance may diminish your experience and disrupt the show for others.
- Visit the bathroom prior to the start of the performance. It is difficult to leave during a performance and you may not be readmitted to the theatre.
- Save your comments on the performance until the end as unnecessary noise disturbs the actors and your fellow audience members.
- Turn off mobile phones. Mobile frequencies disrupt sound equipment and ringing phones interrupt performances. Even illuminated screens can distract fellow audience members and the actors on stage.
- Photography and recording are not permitted in the theatre.
- Food and drink are not permitted in the theatre.
